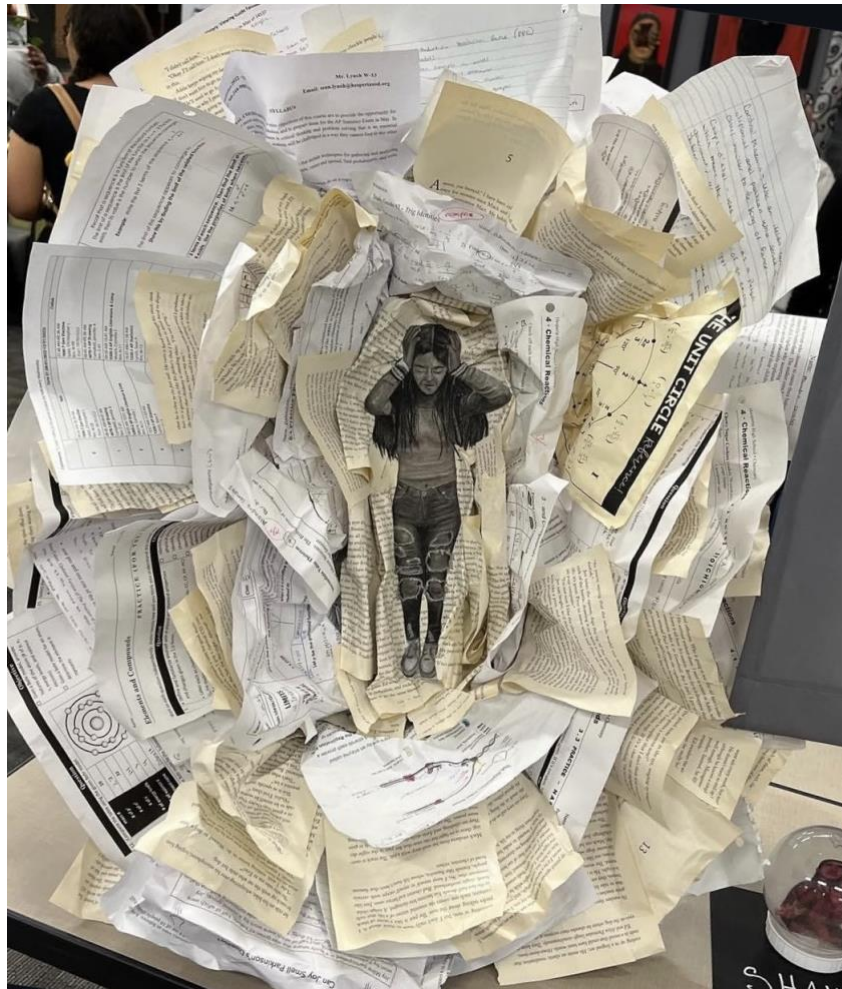




Cover Art: Buried Beneath the Curriculum
